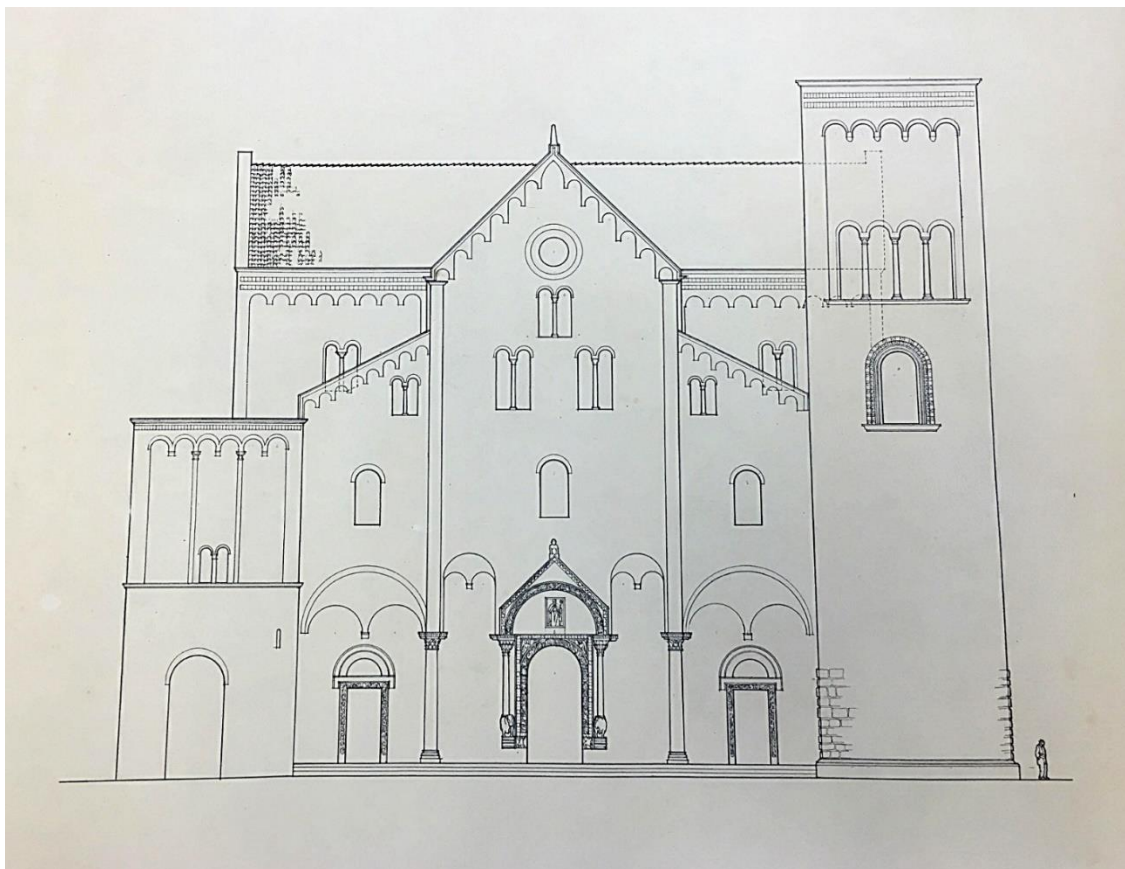

Drawings by New Orleans artist Conrad Albrizio (1894-1973), who painted many large-scale murals for buildings in New Orleans, Louisiana and other gulf south cities. Drawings are a set of undated measured drawings of a Romanesque church at Bari, Italy, made by Albrizio for a proposed publication on Italian Romanesque churches.

Albrizio had a successful career as an artist in New Orleans, working mainly as a muralist. He painted murals inside the Union Passenger Station in New Orleans and at the State Fair Exhibition Building in Shreveport, Louisiana, and many others
