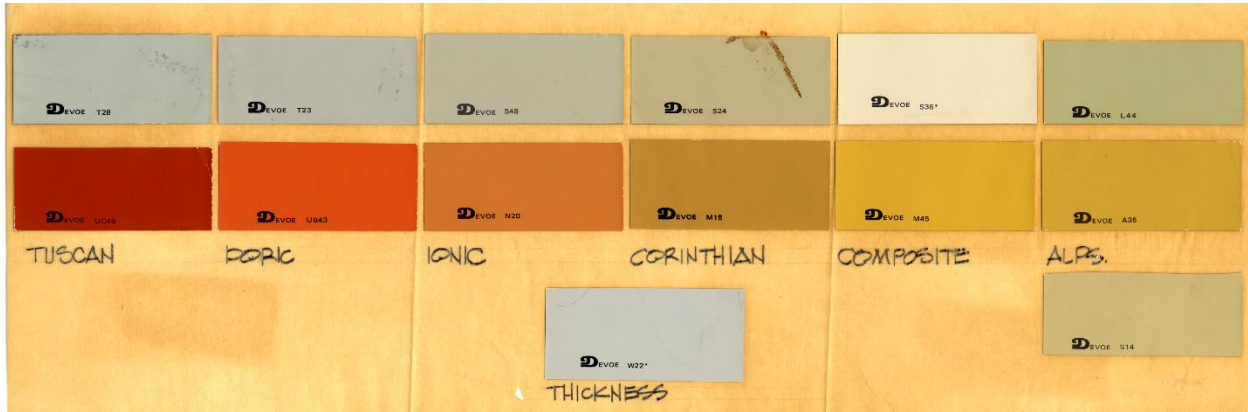


# R. Allen Eskew Material

Records contain a small amount of items from New Orleans architect R. Allen Eskew (1948-2013). Eskew was a native of Alexandria, Louisiana, and received his bachelor's degree in architecture at Louisiana State University, and his master's degree in architecture at the University of California, Berkeley. He was an architect with the New Orleans firm August Perez, III and Associates, and was on the design team, which included Charles Moore, for the Piazza d'Italia in New Orleans. He was studio director for the 1984 Louisiana World Exposition, in New Orleans, managing a team of architects from around the country, including Frank Gehry. In 1986 he established the firm Eskew, Vogt, Salvato, and Filson. In 2000, the firm became Eskew, Dumez, Ripple. Eskew worked on many important projects in New Orleans and the Gulf Coast region, among them the Aquarium of the Americas, Woldenberg Park, Ernest N. Morial Convention Center, and the recent Crescent Park, all in New Orleans.

Included in these records are awards/certificates, photographs of Eskew, and a few items associated with the Piazza d'Italia.
