Personal and professional papers of businessman and author Henri Gandolfo (1897-1990) of New Orleans. Most of the material concerns his nearly 70 year association with the Albert Weiblen Marble and Granite Company (founded 1889), and the company into which it was later merged, Stewart Enterprises, Incorporated. Most of the correspondence dates to World War I, when he served as Sergeant in the Army's Personnel Adjutant Section of the 17th Division at Camp Beauregard in Louisiana.
