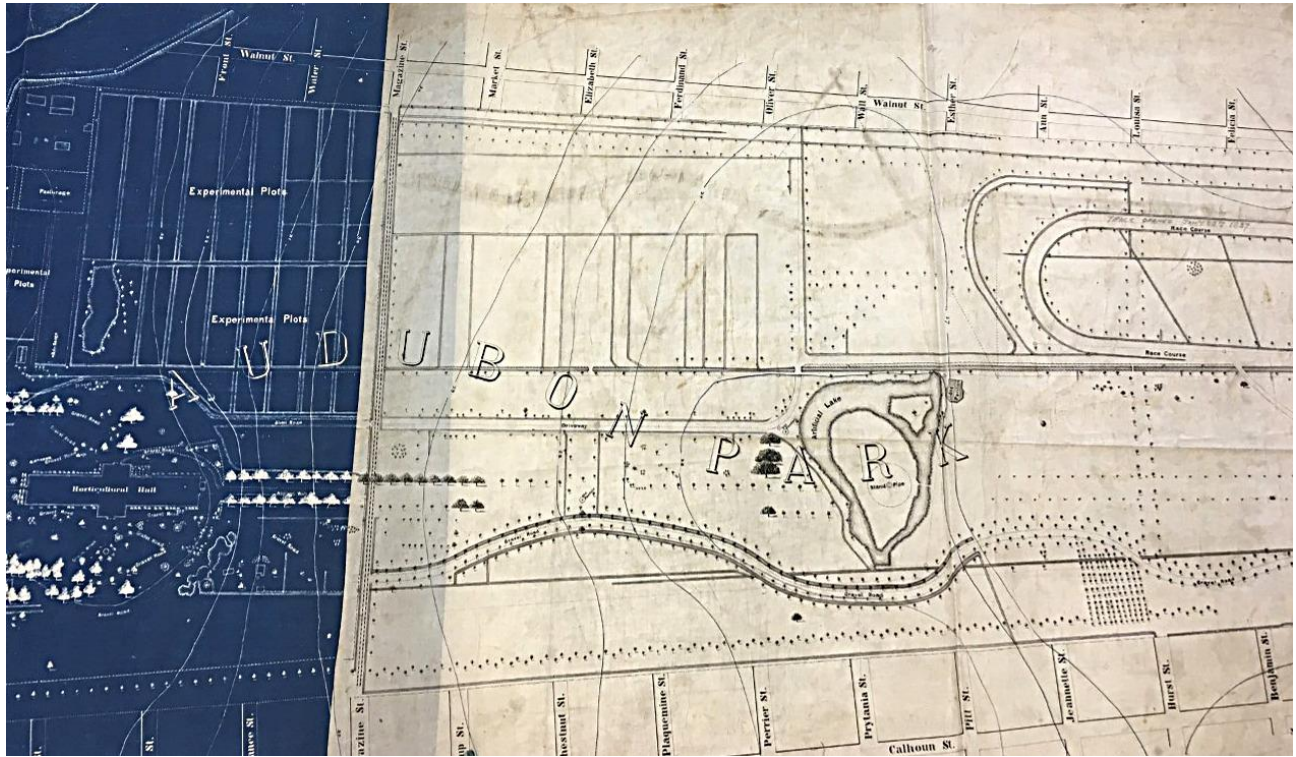

Drawings for improvements to Audubon Park, New Orleans, Louisiana. Included is a design by the Olmsted Brothers, Boston, for a pavilion for the park, blueprints for the aviary at the Audubon Park Zoo by Walter Cook Keenan, New Orleans. There is also an 1894 map showing Horticultural Hall, built for the 1884 Cotton Centennial Exposition and destroyed in the 1915 hurricane, and the race track.
