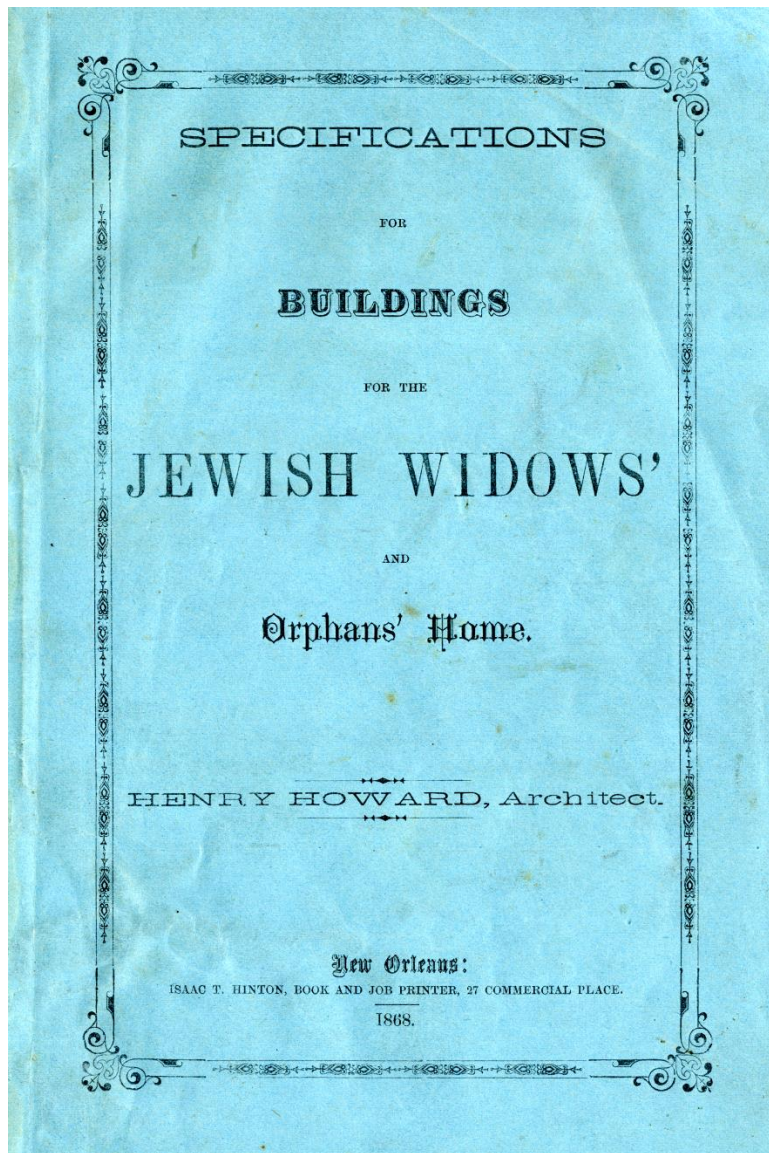

Folder 3. Constance Street, between Basin and Robin Streets, New Orleans, LA. Two-story frame house and kitchen with a stable. Ca.1850s.

Folder 4. First Presbyterian Church, removal of pipe organ and installing in a new church building to be erected. Sam Stone, R. and Company, Incorporated; Douglas V. Freret, associated architects. February 21, 1938.

Folder 5. Baccich and De Montluzin, architects. Lamothe residence, interior arrangement floor plan. Unidentified location. October 1910.

Folder 6. Conti Street, between Bourbon and Dauphine Streets, New Orleans, LA. Two-story warehouse for L. Grunewald. May 15, 1894. Toledano and Reusch, architects.
