Copy prints of original albumen photographs made by German-born 19th century New Orleans photographer, Theodore Lilienthal (1829-1894), for the Paris Exposition of 1867. The city of New Orleans commissioned Lilienthal to create the photographs as a campaign to promote the city post-Civil War. At the end of the exposition, the photographs, in a portfolio, titled, *La Nouvelle Orleans*

et ses environs, were presented to French emperor Napoleon III. The photographs were included in the possessions of Napoleon III, housed in his family's home in Arenenberg, Switzerland. The home is now the Napoleon Museum Thurgau, and operated as a house museum, where these original photographs reside. The originals were exhibited at Tulane University and the New Orleans Museum of Art in 2000. SEAA's set of copy prints was paid for by SEAA, with the consent of the Napoleon Museum for the benefit of regional researchers.
